Many of you will also be wondering what exactly is going to happen on GCSE Results Day in August. Discussions about the issuing of results are still taking place as the public health situation changes and more information on this will be with you in due course. However the key thing for you to remember is that so long as your GCSE results exceed the minimum requirement (an average of 6.4375 across your best eight GCSEs including Maths and English Language) you will automatically have a place in Year 12 here in September. You will, however, also need to meet the entry criteria for each of your chosen subjects.

In the unfortunate event either that you fall a little below the minimum requirement or that you don't quite reach the grade needed for a particular subject we will meet with you as a matter of priority to discuss how we can best help you.

Once you have confirmed that you have accepted your place in Year 12 you will be sent some forms for you and your parents to complete and we will look forward to seeing you on Friday  $4^{th}$  September.
